



TECHNOLOGIES THIS MONTH

5G IS HERE:



In telecommunications, 5G is the fifth-generation technology standard for broadband mobile networks, mobile companies that began operating globally in 2019, and is a planned follower of 4G networks that provide connectivity to many modern phones. 5G networks are predicted to have more than 1.7 billion subscribers worldwide by 2025, according to the GSM Association.

In March 2019, the Global Mobile Suppliers Association released the first industry website to track the launch of 5G devices worldwide. In it, GSA has identified 23 vendors that have secured the availability of upcoming 5G devices with 33 different devices for different regional integration. There are seven announced features of the 5G device form: (phones (\times 12 devices), hot spots (\times 4), internal and external customer furniture (\times 8), modules (\times 5), dongles and adapters (\times 2)), and USB terminals (\times 1)). [47] As of October 2019, the number of 5G devices announced has risen to 129, in all 15 form factors, from 56 vendors.

In the 5G IoT chipset arena, as of April 2019 there were four commercial 5G modem chipsets and one commercial processor/platform, with more launches expected soon.

On March 6, 2020, the first-ever all-5G smartphone Samsung Galaxy S20 was released. According to *Business Insider*, the 5G feature was showcased as more

expensive in comparison with 4G; the lineup starts at US\$1,000, in comparison with Samsung Galaxy S10e which started at US\$750. On March 19, HMD Global, the current maker of Nokia-branded phones, announced the Nokia 8.3 5G, which it claimed as having a wider range of 5G compatibility than any other phone released to that time. The mid-range model, with an initial Eurozone price of €599, is claimed to support all 5G bands from 600 MHz to 3.8 GHz.



On October 13, 2020, Apple announced the iPhone 12 and the iPhone 12 Pro, the first line of Apple phones to support 5G connectivity. Apple collaborated with Verizon to enable 5G plans on iPhone 12.


5G-Advanced is a name for 3GPP release 18. The standard will be commercially available around 2025.

PROJECT SOPHIA:

Razer Project Sophia is an all-in-one modular desk with an integrated PC.

Razer's latest CES moonshot is a desk that looks like a workstation from a scifi starship. On Wednesday, Razer unveiled its latest concept design for CES 2022, called "Project Sophia." This futuristic-looking desk is customizable with various modules that lock into the desktop magnetically from below. It's a gamer's dream or nightmare, depending on how one feels about power consumption.









For starters, the desk is not just a desk. It's a full PCB computer system with the "latest Intel processors and Nvidia GPUs". The computer component magnetically snaps into the bottom of the glass desktop in the top-center module housing.

Razer envisions it being used by gamers, content creators, streamers, or business professionals, with its modularity meaning it can be quickly reconfigured to fit multiple roles.

"Project Sophia is our futuristic vision of a multi-purpose gaming and workstation setup which meets the very different needs of a variety of PC uses,

negating the need to move between workspaces", said Razer's Vice President of Groth Richard Hashim. "The hot-swappable modular system allows users to quickly reconfigure their desk with near-infinite flexibility, adapting Project Sophia not just for the task at hand but also to the user's particular preference. This is the future of the battle station".

ODYSSEY ARK:

Samsung reveals the Odyssey Ark, a 55-inch curved gaming monitor that can rotate into portrait mode.



The most noticeable element of this monitor is that it's massive: an outrageous 55-inches, making it the size of many standard television sets. Samsung says the 16:9 display's "multi-view" feature uses an "adaptable screen size to fit the game or the program without compromising its 4K display and bright, colorful images." It also comes with a dial controller for managing the lighting and the interface.

The monitor has what looks like an extreme curve. Samsung didn't reveal the radius (R). The 49-inch Odyssey Neo G9 has a 1000R curve, so we could be looking at the same thing here.









But the most interesting feature in the Odyssey Ark is its ability to swivel into portrait mode. It's a feature available in plenty of monitors, but not something you'd expect to find in one measuring 55-inches and with such an aggressive curve. Samsung says it gives users a "cockpit-style" view to "[offer] a new gaming experience." Tim Schofield shows how this orientation can be used for multitasking with games, streams, and videos open simultaneously.







